

For your diary: April 17th: Annual Parish Meeting/Annual Parochial Church Meeting

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting receives reports on the life of the church and hears any questions which you may have about St Leonard's. It also elects members to the PCC, and anyone who is on the church electoral roll may vote.

Since Mr. Ron Backholler retired as Churchwarden a year ago, Mrs. Janet Smith has been doing a magnificent job as sole Churchwarden, but every parish should really have two Churchwardens, and so we urgently need a second Churchwarden to share the task with Janet. 

Children at St. Leonard's Church



We love having children in our church, and there is always provision for them at our 9.30 a.m. services. All families with babies and children are sure of a warm welcome whenever they can join us.
All our Sunday morning services start at 9.30 a.m., and the pattern is:

2nd Sunday in every month: Village Worship.

The most informal of all our services. We start in the Church Centre (warm and welcoming) with workshop activities for children, and coffee, puzzles and chat for grown ups to get to know one another. At about 10.00 we move into church for a short and childcentred service. There is no need to be there on the dot of 9.30- people drift in as soon as they can make it.

4th Sunday in every month: Family Service.

An all-age service of readings, songs and activities with everybody young and old in church together. Children always participate in the readings/ drama sketches etc. and several people bring instruments to accompany the songs. (and any other musicians among you and your children would be very welcome to join them) Tea/coffee and cake after the service in the Church Centre.

Ist and 3rd Sundays in every month: Parish Communion with Sunday School.

Tea/coffee and the chance to socialise after every service. Children start the service in church with their parents, and after the first hymn go out for Sunday School activities in the Church Centre, returning to receive a blessing at the time of Communion. Parents are welcome to accompany their little ones to Sunday School and stay with them if they lack confidence at first.

At these services, we also have a robed choir which includes older children (aged about 8 and upwards) and teenagers: anyone whose son/daughter likes singing might consider encouraging them to join the choir. Thought for the month: From our Rector, the Revd. David Wintle.

Scientists are very excited about gravitational waves. They were predicted by the great theoretical physicist Albert Einstein more than 100 years ago, and now they have been detected. We are told that this discovery will completely change the way we think about the universe, but I suspect it won't – after all, for many years, scientists have been assuming that gravitational waves existed even though nobody had found any.

And the rest of us, if we bother to look up gravitational waves on Wikipedia, will find stuff like this:

$$P = \frac{\mathrm{d}E}{\mathrm{d}t} = -\frac{32}{5} \frac{G^4}{c^5} \frac{(m_1 m_2)^2 (m_1 + m_2)}{r^5}$$

As we can't make head nor tail of that, it's not likely to make us change our way of thinking. Anyway, gravity seems to be pretty much as it always has been – we haven't suddenly started floating about.

However, Prof. Michio Kaku, of the City College in New York, says that eventually "We should be at the brink of being able to test for the impossible, that is, the world before the big bang", to get back to before time and space existed, before the universe came into being. Will we be able to prove the existence of God?


Well, not exactly. Professor Kaku thinks that what we will find will be another universe that existed before our universe, which by some process currently not understood had a baby – and that baby is our universe.

Science can tell us a lot about reality, but not everything. When I am with someone I love, that person is far and away the most real thing in the room. The walls and the ceiling and the floor are there all right, but they don't really register with me. Reality for me in that moment is not something that can be explained by physics. If that person were to die, then what endured of them would be the memories that I cherish. Love does not die. If I knew them totally and loved them perfectly, then it would be as if they had never died; they would live on in me.

Jesus, the night before he was to die on the Cross, said this: "Father, I desire that these also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world."

So if Jesus is right and if I am right, then love existed before creation, and it will continue to exist when time and space are no more.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life."

Lent Lunches at Baginton


Lent Lunches will be taking place every Tuesday in Lent, starting at 12.30 p.m. Cost: £3.50. Profits for Church funds. Details below:
