Lent jars in aid of the Motor Neurone Disease Assoiociation.


The total contributed to our Lent Jars initiative in support of the Motor Neurone Disease Association was £439. 23



Thought for the month: The Kingfisher.



Some of you may know Medbourne. It's a pretty village about 30 miles away, in Rutland. It's one of those villages which, like Wolston, has a brook running through it, and one day last August I was sitting beside the brook, waiting for some cousins whom we had arranged to meet there for a pub lunch.

And that's when I saw the kingfisher. I hadn't seen one since I was a child, and I'd forgotten how tiny they are, and how vivid that iridescent blue plumage is. He suddenly appeared and alighted on a stone at the edge of the water, not more than 6 feet from where I was sitting on the top of the bank. I could hardly believe that I was being so privileged as to see one after so many years, and so nearby.

He sat there for perhaps a minute, then he was gone, a streak of vivid blue, swift as an arrow, upstream, under the bridge and out of my sight.

I had the feeling that I had seen something significant, a vision almost, although the kingfisher was real enough, vibrantly alive as he came to perch near me for a moment, then flew off beyond the bridge, where I could see him no more.

When we got home that afternoon, we heard that our dear friend had died, probably about an hour after I had seen the kingfisher.

And it seemed to me that the kingfisher was a sign to me. The way he was so vividly alive there beside me, then swiftly darted away out of my sight, beyond the bridge. I couldn't see him any more, but I knew that he was still alive, somewhere upstream, the other side of the bridge. And I knew too that, although we could no longer see our friend, he too was vibrantly alive, somewhere upstream, beyond the bridge.

And I knew that, wherever he was, he was all right.
