The collection raised £66.40 in aid of the British legion.



We are desperate for volunteer drivers for our fortnightly meetings and occasional shopping trips. Please can you help!



THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH:

From our Rector, the Revd. David Wintle.

More people come to church around Christmas than any other time of the year, and I've noticed that more and more grown-ups are coming to the crib services, that are meant for children, and fewer and fewer come to the midnight service or on Christmas morning.

I can see why hard-pressed people are attracted to a short simple service at a convenient time rather than one that goes on a bit and starts in the middle of the night or at some unearthly hour in the morning. And of course you get to see the children do their stuff and that always brings a lump into your throat: Christmas is really for the children isn't it?

Yes it is, but Christmas is for the grown-ups too. Maybe for cynical adults the story is too sugary and too neat; perhaps it doesn't quite ring true. We think it couldn't possibly have been like that, so we say oh well, it's just a story and the children love it, and we like to see them all dressed up and so on.

Well it wasn't quite like that. First of all the date is wrong. A monk in the 6th century got his counting wrong and Jesus was possibly born between 8 and 4 BC. Lambing time in Israel, when the shepherds spend all night with their flocks, is March or October, not December, so Jesus must have been born in the spring or the autumn. If Bethlehem was where Joseph's family lived, why did Mary and Joseph have to stay in an inn? The word usually translated as "inn" means "guest room", so they probably did stay with family, and people in those days slept alongside the animals. So no innkeeper. No donkey or ox mentioned in the Bible, either. By the time the wise men turned up – maybe two years after Jesus was born, not at the same time as the shepherds – Mary, Joseph and Jesus were definitely in a house, not a stable.

What happens if we peel away the layers of romance from the story? Do we destroy it? No. In fact, what we have here is a story that grown-ups can relate to. It's harder-edged, less syrupy, more real; it makes more sense to our adult minds; you can probe it, you can question it, but it rings true. It stands up to criticism and enquiry. The heart of the story is still there: Jesus was born at Bethlehem in the days of Herod the King. A real place and a real moment in history. And he was born not just for the children, but for all of us. He came to show us what God is like, and God is real – it's just that God is so awesome that people can't help embroidering the story.

So a very happy Christmas 2017 – or possibly 2021 – to you all.
