

Anne has also very ably and willingly acted as accompanist to the special events sung by the Augmented Choir.


More recently, **Michael Spencer** has joined us to play for the evening services- why not came along and enjoy his playing at

Church Organ restoration.

We have been advised that the organ at St Leonard's Church is in urgent need of repairs and upgrades. The likely bill will be in the region of £18,500. In order to finance this, your PCC has opened an **Organ Fund,** and we have already received a generous anonymous gift towards this, and



the fund has already reached the sum of £2,164.00.

We shall be engaging in various fundraising events to raise further funds, including the following already planned:

April 28 at Ryton Village Hall: Swing into Spring- popular music from the 1960's, -70's and 80's. Price £5. Bring your own food.

June 9: Hymnathon in Church.

Coventry Pilgrimage 2018: The Pilgrim group will be passing through



Bubbenhall and Ryton on May 26. Come and join them!

Pilgrims approach Bubbenhall Church on previous Pilgrimage.

To be a pilgrim is to undertake a journey with a spiritual purpose. We invite you to walk some or all of the Coventry Pilgrimage route in 2018.

In 2018, in celebration of the Centenary of the modern Coventry Diocese, all are invited to participate in walking some or all of the Coventry Pilgrimage route in short sections (4 to 6 miles) on the last Saturday morning of each month for 9 months from March to November.

What is it? We will walk the almost 50 mile route, circling Coventry from church to church around the Coventry Way footpath and reaching the Cathedral down the Sherbourne Valley Way. We will walk a section of about 4 to 6 miles on the last Saturday morning of each month for 9 months from Easter Eve, March 31st, to the Eve of Christ the King, November 24th.

Why are we doing it? To wait for and welcome Christ the King in Coventry.

To spend time with friends and make new friends – building a reconciling community.

To celebrate the Centenary of Coventry Diocese.

To explore and enjoy our environment. Because walking is good for us!

When is it? We will meet outside a church at 10 am on the last Saturday morning of each month and set off by 10.15 am.

March 31st St Laurence Meriden via St John the Baptist Berkswell to Burton Green Village Hall (congregation of Westwood Church Coventry) 5.4 miles

April 28th Burton Green Village Hall (congregation of Westwood Church Coventry) to St Mary Stoneleigh May 26th St Mary Stoneleigh via St Giles Bubbenhall to St Leonard Ryton on Dunsmore 5.8 miles. Leaving Bubbenhall Church approx. midday (11.45- 12.15 approx.) Arrive Ryton approx. 1.30 p.m. June 30th St Leonard Ryton on Dunsmore via St Margaret Wolston to St John the Baptist Brinklow 5.9 miles

Who is it for? Anyone, church-goer or not, who wants to pray Christ's peace and blessing where we walk and on Coventry. Particularly welcome are all who work, volunteer or worship around the route. Pilgrims walk at their own risk. Under 16s welcome but must be accompanied by a responsible adult. Well-behaved dogs welcome.

How do I get involved? Just turn up. No need to register. Because the walks are linear not circular, if possible arrange transport in a group, sharing cars and leaving a car at your destination, before driving to the starting point. There will be a few lifts back to the starting point for stranded drivers if needed. Wear trainers, walking boots or sturdy shoes and bring a waterproof and some water. Bring a flask and a snack if you like.

Everybody welcome- do come along and celebrate Our Lord's institution of Holy Communion.





Thought for the Month From our Rector, the Revd. David Wintle



Before 1834, the Bank of England observed about 30 saints' days and religious festivals as holidays, but somebody was a spoilsport and in 1834 this was reduced to four: I May (May Day), I November (All Saints Day), Good Friday, and Christmas Day. These holidays were not for everybody, only for bank employees. In 1871, a law – The Bank Holidays Act - was passed making certain days holidays for almost everybody. Since then we have lost the odd bank holiday here and there, gained several other days, and one or two bank holidays have been moved around – like the August bank holiday, which used to be at the beginning of

the month and is now at the end.

Here we are in May, a month which nowadays has two bank holidays, May Day or Early Spring Bank Holiday, and Late Spring Bank Holiday. Do these get jumbled together in your mind – or is it just me? May Day of course is a name for Ist May, and it was a traditional springtime celebration observed by many cultures. Other May Day celebrations relate to Labour Day – "an international celebration of the social and economic achievements of the working class and labour movement." Our early Spring Bank Holiday is on the first Monday in May and most of the celebrations connected with Ist May have been transferred to it, at least in England.

What about the end of the month? When I was at school we had 'Whit' week off school as half term, whenever that might fall, and the first day of our half term holiday was a bank holiday, Whit Monday, the day after Whitsunday. Now the last Monday of May is taken as the Late Spring Bank Holiday, wherever Whitsuntide, or Pentecost as the Christian Church

is more likely to call it nowadays, falls. Whitsun or Pentecost has taken a back seat in general culture.

This is unfortunate because for Christians Pentecost is central to our faith. It is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. We think of the time seven weeks after Easter, when the disciples were still bewildered and afraid. They had seen Jesus dead and buried; they had witnessed Jesus' resurrection



appearances and his ascension into heaven. No wonder they were confused. But, in some amazing and dramatic way, God's Holy Spirit came to them and transformed them into people of power and conviction. They were enabled to preach and teach, and more and more people came to believe in Jesus. The same Holy Spirit of God is alive and active today – challenging us to live a more worthwhile life, giving us peace and comfort and strength for each day, and pointing us to Jesus who lived and died and rose again to show us that God's love is stronger even than death itself.

And in case you are, like the disciples, bewildered and confused, let me just tell you that this year Whitsun or Pentecost falls on 21 May – that's right, just over a week before the Late Spring Bank holiday.


