

The Bells of St.
Leonard's... are ringing
again!
Tower captain John
Hammond writes...

As the village have probably noticed, after a lengthy absence due to the COVID restrictions, we have started bell ringing practice again 7:30-9pm on a Monday evening. I'm pleased to say this includes some new starters.

During the lockdown along with many other churches, we tolled a bell to mark the passing of HRH The Duke of Edinburgh and again for his funeral. We are all very much looking forward to ringing for the communion services again starting in September.

Organ: a message from organist Mike Spencer



I've been asked to write a few words about the organ Firstly, all credit must go to John Church and Janet for setting the funding process in motion; after getting quotes they arranged many events to raise money for the project and took the decision earlier in the year to go ahead, having received a substantial

anonymous donation that boosted the fund.

The main work was to remove the wiring at the back of the keyboards, which the mice had been enjoying for a long time, and install a solid state computerised capture system, which will last a very long time.

This has made the organ much more responsive and easier to play. It also presented an opportunity to make tonal additions to the organ, ie, add a few sounds to improve its capabilities Peter Spencer, the organ builder, made suggestions, and we had funds to do most of the work-there is one last sound to add, for which we need to raise a final £3000, so the organ fund will be open for a while longer, with further fundraising events in the pipeline.

However, we have to bear in mind that there are other calls on the church finances at this time, so the organ must take its turn!

Thanks for supporting the organ fund-St Leonard's now has an instrument which is well suited to the church, and will serve for many years. Mike

Mike is now playing for all our morning and evening services: we are very lucky to have found such a skilled -and voluntary- organist. We must also record our profound gratitude to Anne Walters who has played the organ and accompanied so many choir events and concerts over the years. Sadly, Anne has had to retire owing to ill-health. Editor.


New adult choir members always welcome too: If you enjoy singing and would like to join either the robed choir who sing for services twice a month, or

Children at St. Leonard's Church

We love having children in our church, and there is always provision for them at our 9.30 a.m. services. All families with babies and children are sure of a warm welcome whenever they can join us.

All our Sunday morning services start at 9.30 a.m., and the pattern is:

2nd Sunday in every month: Village Worship.

The most informal of all our services. We start in the Church Centre (warm and welcoming) with workshop activities for children, and coffee, puzzles and chat for grown ups to get to know one another. At about 10.00 we move into church for a short and child-centred service. There is no need to be there on the dot of 9.30- people drift in as soon as they can make it

4th Sunday in every month: Family Service.

An all-age service of readings, songs and activities with everybody young and old in church together. Children always participate in the readings/ drama sketches etc. and several people bring instruments to accompany the songs... (and any other musicians among you and your children would be very welcome to join them) Tea/coffee and cake/biscuits after the service in the Church Centre.

Ist and 3rd Sundays in every month: Parish Communion with Sunday School. Tea/coffee and the chance to socialise after every service. Children start the service in church with their parents, and after the first hymn go out for Sunday School activities in the Church Centre, returning to receive a blessing at the time of Communion.

Parents are welcome to accompany their little ones to Sunday School and stay with them if they lack confidence at first.

We value children at St Leonard's, and make them and their parents welcome.



Thought for the month: Treasure in Clay Balls

2 Corinthians 4:7 "But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us."



A man was exploring caves by the seashore. In one of the caves he found a canvas bag with a bunch of hardened clay balls. It was like someone had rolled the clay balls and left them out in the sun to bake. They didn't look like much, but they intrigued the man, so he took the bag out of the cave with him.

As he strolled along the beach, he threw the balls one at a time out into the ocean as far as he could.

He thought little about it, until he dropped one and it cracked open on a rock . Inside was a beautiful, precious stone - treasure in clay!

Excited, the man started breaking open the remaining clay balls. Each contained a similar treasure. He found thousands of pounds worth of jewels in the 20 or so balls he had left.

Then it struck him. He had been on the beach a long time. He had thrown maybe 50 or 60 of the balls with their hidden treasure in the clay into the ocean waves. Instead of thousands of pounds in treasure, he could have taken home tens of thousands, but he had just thrown it away!

It's like that with people. We look at someone, maybe even ourselves, and we see the external clay vessel. It doesn't look like much from the outside. It isn't always beautiful or sparkling, so we discount it.

We see that person as not very interesting- not good-looking or well known or wealthy. But we have not taken the time to find the treasure in clay – hidden inside that person.

There is a treasure in every one of us. If we take the time to get to know that person, then the clay begins to crack open and the brilliant gem begins to shine.

May we not throw away a fortune in friendships because the gems were hidden in bits of clay. May we see the people in our world as God sees them.
